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Introduction


We present the results of the second national audit which examines the organisation of services provided to older people for falls prevention and bone health. Falls and fractures are a common and serious problem affecting older people, with high levels of personal and financial cost. National guidelines, supported by the research evidence, require the provision of integrated services for falls and fracture prevention and treatment. Effective commissioning is needed to produce such high quality services.

This audit was commissioned by the Healthcare Quality Improvement Partnership (HQIP) as part of the second cycle of audits on services for the prevention of falls and fractures in older people. It follows the first organisational audit, performed in 2005, and the clinical audit of 2007. All were audited against specific standards from the National Service Framework for Older People (NSF) and guidance from the National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence (NICE). Since the first audit, indicators have been added or updated in line with new guidance including that on falls prevention of inpatients following the National Patient Safety Agency (NPSA) report on slips, trips and falls in hospital (2007). For the first time, the audit also looks specifically at falls and fracture prevention in mental healthcare and a sample of care homes.

We are grateful for the hard work of many NHS professionals, who have contributed to a very high return rate – 93% (315/337) of acute trusts, primary care organisations and health and social care trusts in England, Wales and Northern Ireland. We are confident that we have produced a reliable and comprehensive picture of services across these three home nations.

The results show that, despite modest improvements since the first audit, major variation between trusts persist, and deficiencies in care remain widespread. We make recommendations that will lead to better falls and bone health services, and which can be implemented cost-effectively by the NHS. We urge you to consider the key messages and recommendations in the report. There is much that can be done, and must be done, to reduce injury, disability and preventable death from falls and fractures.



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Executive Summary

Each year, over 700,000 older people in the United Kingdom (UK) attend hospital accident and emergency departments (A&E) following a fall and many more attend minor injury units (MIUs), or call for ambulance assistance. Falls and resultant fractures in people aged 65 and over account for over 4 million bed days each year in England alone. Injurious falls, including over 60,000 hip fractures annually, are the leading cause of accident-related mortality in older people. Falls may also result in loss of confidence, activity restriction, reduced functional ability and thus increased dependency on carers and services.

Well organised services, based on national standards and evidence-based guidelines can prevent future falls and reduce death and disability from fractures. As judged against these standards, this audit shows that the large variation in the quality of services observed in the 2005 audit were still evident in 2008. Some services are doing well but there are important deficiencies in commissioning and in the provision of care. The high rate of participation in this audit, however, demonstrates strong commitment in the NHS to monitoring quality and we believe there is an appetite to do better. These results deserve serious local scrutiny to develop the improvements needed.

Headline findings

1. Opportunities to prevent recurrent falls and fractures are being missed:
 - a. Risk assessments in A&E departments and Fracture services are inadequate.
 - b. Services with Falls Coordinators and Fracture Liaison Nurses have better case finding systems in place to identify high risk fallers.
 - c. Most trusts have developed inpatient falls policies, but only a third know their inpatient falls rates.
2. Commissioning is patchy, rarely providing a coordinated falls and fracture strategy:
 - a. Important public health information on fracture rates is inadequate or not collated.
 - b. Only 39% (67/171) of commissioning trusts report being compliant with the NICE technology appraisal on secondary prevention of osteoporotic fragility fractures. This figure contrasts with the results of 2007/8 Healthcare Commission annual health check on NHS trusts, for which the great majority of PCOs in England self-reported as compliant as reflected in Core Standard 5a. This public reassurance about fracture prevention services turns out to be misleading since only 24% (40/169) have audited bone health prescribing in their local primary care and only 9 know their local fragility fracture rates.
3. Many clinical services are not adhering to the NICE CG21 and TAG 87 guideline-based treatments to prevent falls and fractures:
 - a. Patients with first fractures are not flagged up for secondary prevention.
 - b. Many of the exercise programmes being provided are not evidence based.
 - c. Too few services used patient-agreed treatment plans.
 - d. Assessments for safety at home using a validated approach could be better.

Recommendations

- Primary care organisations (PCOs) should develop commissioning strategies that include:
 - Case finding systems in hospital and community settings to identify high risk fallers
 - Adherence to NICE treatment guidelines with monitoring by local audit
 - Clinical leaders including a consultant with job plan commitment
 - A fracture liaison service
 - Widespread and accessible evidence-based exercise programmes
 - Targeted use of validated home safety assessments.
- The Department of Health should review how it can best support these developments by:
 - Provision of advice on commissioning
 - Strengthening incentives
 - Provision of useful metrics for falls prevention, fractures and osteoporosis treatments.

The NSF, 2001 set out the standards and actions needed to address a range of common health problems in older people. Standard 6 was devoted to falls. Subsequently the National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence, NICE, produced guidance on the clinical practice needed (2004). This set out a strategy for case finding and clinical treatments to reduce the risk of falls and injuries. In 2005, NICE described cost-effective treatments for improving bone health for the secondary prevention of fragility fractures.

Previous audits

The major finding from the first Organisational Audit in 2005 audit was that, whilst 74% of falls services stated they had established an integrated and comprehensive falls service, the details in the audit showed that this was far from the case. Case finding was poorly developed; numbers of patients seen in specialised clinics and for investigations were low; and there was little evidence of effective collaboration between primary and community care, social services and hospital services; or falls prevention and osteoporosis pathways.

This was followed in 2007 by a clinical audit of the care actually received by patients attending hospital with a fragility fracture. This had wide coverage of the NHS (over 90% of trusts) and gave a genuine indication of what care was being received. The findings suggested that there were serious gaps in the provision of secondary prevention for falls and fractures, particularly following non-hip fractures.

Changes since 2005

Following each of the previous audits, the Clinical Effectiveness and Evaluation Unit (CEEU) at the Royal College of Physicians, along with other professional groups have promoted improvements in falls and fracture services in many ways, including a series of regional workshops which were followed by action plans being prepared by trusts and collected by the CEEU on behalf of the Healthcare Commission.

There have of course been competing priorities influencing developments in commissioning and in the services developed by PCOs and acute trusts. In contrast to other clinical areas, there have been no direct incentives, such as exist in the Quality and Outcomes Framework from Primary Care. The 2005 organisational audit was based on data collected from acute trusts only although it included information they had obtained from local primary care trusts (England). This audit sought to obtain a wider picture across the whole health economy, including acute trusts, PCOs (Local Health Boards and Primary Care Trusts), mental healthcare trusts/services and a sample of care homes. This is the most definitive examination of falls and bone health services ever conducted, in the UK or elsewhere.

Audit standards and indicators

The audit questions have been derived from the following sources:

- National Service Framework for Older People (NSF) Chapter 6 “Falls”, 2001
- National Service Framework for Older People in Wales (NSF Wales) Standard 8 “Falls and Fractures”, 2006
- National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence (NICE) Clinical Guideline 21 “Falls: The assessment and prevention of falls in older people”, 2004 (NICE CG 21)
- NICE Technology Appraisal Guidance 87, “Bisphosphonates (alendronate, etidronate or risedronate), selective oestrogen receptor modulators (raloxifene) and parathyroid hormone (teriparatide) for the secondary prevention of osteoporotic fragility fractures in post menopausal women”, 2005 (NICE TAG 87)
- British Orthopaedic Association (BOA), “The Care of Fragility Fracture Patients” (Blue book), 2007
- Department of Health (DH) “Urgent Care Pathways for Older People with Complex Needs”, 2007
- NHS National Patient Safety Agency (NPSA), “Slips trips and falls in hospital”, 2007.

*Subsequently superseded by the equivalent updated TAG 161 on secondary prevention, but TAG 87 was the relevant guideline at the time of the audit.

Questions were arranged in the following domains. Depending on the nature of the trust undertaking the audit, some domains applied, some did not:

Scoring systems

The scoring system was devised so that each site could benchmark their performance for the relevant domains (Table 1) and organisation of care index (which is the weighted average of the domain scores) in comparison with other sites in their healthcare sector (acute, primary care or mental healthcare trusts). The individual site results by domains and index are not identified to the public. Results within the report also provide the national picture for each healthcare setting.

For the first time, the results of some selected audit items have been collected together as “**Public Indicators**”. These were developed by the full multi-professional steering group who included representatives such as clinicians, managers and commissioners from all the different types of healthcare settings. The public indicators that have been selected are those which are most important, generally relating directly to the national guidance, and for which we believe the evidence base is most reliable. In addition, the indicators were kept to a manageable number, so as to make presentation user-friendly. The public indicators are presented in this report as non-anonymised information where sites are identified by name within their strategic health authorities.

Understanding the Results

In this 2008 audit, we are therefore assessing who provides what services, as well as how well organised they are. Direct comparison between settings is generally not possible as different audit questions applied to the various settings depending, on their role. Only local scrutiny of these results by multi-agency partnerships will clarify where gaps are. For example, an acute trust cannot achieve “full marks” if the local arrangements are that certain services are provided only by the PCO community services. Sharing reports will promote discussion locally.

Comparisons with First Round Audit (2005)

The results from this audit cannot be directly compared with that from 2005. The 2005 organisational audit was answered by acute trusts in England. Each provided information about the organisation of care across their local falls service as a whole. So, if their patients received a falls risk in the community, this was entered on their behalf by the acute trust. This more ambitious 2008 audit obtained data separately from commissioning trusts, community, acute and mental healthcare service providers, providing a much fuller picture and a more informative baseline for future comparisons.

Key messages from the audit

For most domains the median scores for individual trusts indicated adherence to about half the audit standards but the scores were highly variable, showing that high quality strategic commissioning and comprehensive and well integrated service provision is possible.

Identifying the high risk patients

- Just over half (51%, 148/289) of providers with an A&E or MIU routinely screen older people attending with falls for risk of future falls. In 2005, 29% (44/150) of falls services reported that such patients would be assessed by the specialist falls service during “office hours”. There has probably been some improvement but it should be universally done, as the evidence for secondary prevention of falls is strongest for those who attend urgent care.
- Only in 44% (85/193) of sites are older people admitted to hospital with a fracture routinely screened for osteoporosis risk. Perhaps this explains why only 28% (2339/8341) of fragility fracture patients in the 2007 clinical audit had been started on the relevant medication for bone protection by 12 weeks after fracture. Since 50% of patients with a hip fracture have previously had a fragility fracture of another bone, this shows that opportunities for secondary prevention (as set out by NICE) are being missed.
- Patients who are **admitted** with a fracture are more likely to receive an assessment for osteoporosis than patients **attending** fracture clinic.
- This lack of arrangements to promote secondary prevention for fragility fractures is particularly disappointing. Half of hip fracture patients have had a previous fragility fracture. This is an opportunity to act and the treatments available can reduce subsequent fractures by up to 50% over the following years. What could be conceptually more convincing than applying a treatment with up to 50% efficacy in the prevention of a major injury, after an initial “warning” event? Neurovascular services are being established from all PCOs based on a similar approach to secondary stroke prevention after transient ischaemic attacks.
- A service model to bridge this gap, the Fracture Liaison Service, has existed for over a decade and numerous research evaluations have confirmed its effectiveness in ensuring better rates of secondary prevention. Fracture Liaison Services have yet to become universally commissioned or provided.

Doing the right things with patients at risk

- 50% (151/302) of sites do not employ a proforma to prompt standardised visual acuity assessment and 48% (70/146) of PCOs do not assess cardiac status including a basic electrocardiogram (ECG).
- The most effective component of multiple component falls risk reduction programmes is evidence based individually-prescribed and supervised strength and balance training programmes of sufficient duration to produce significant change. Only 38% (108/286) of services provide a programme which meet our fairly strict criteria for effectiveness based on research evidence.
- Home hazard assessment along with advice on safe and effective performance of activities of daily living is a proven component of falls reduction programmes, particularly if patients have experienced a recent change in health such as a hospital admission or injurious fall. But only 41% (123/303) of sites include a validated approach to this aspect of falls prevention.
- Patient uptake and adherence to active interventions that include changes in health related behaviour does depend on information and explanation for patients. This is highlighted in the NSF, but only 35% (122/351) of sites provide a written agreed intervention plan for their patients after an assessment.

Supporting services to get it right for their inpatients and residents

- Half of trusts (52%, 183/353) providing falls services did not provide any training to care homes or guidance on when residents should be referred to falls services; indeed a quarter (24%, 85/352) provided no access to these services for care home residents.
- Although most trusts with inpatients (83%, 314/379) had policies or procedures to minimise falls and injuries, primary care providers [with community hospitals or intermediate care beds] and mental healthcare trusts were more likely NOT to have them (29%, 41/140 and 17%, 8/46 respectively) than acute trusts (5%, 10/183).

Raising quality now and in the future

- The PCOs with a written commissioning strategy for falls prevention (Domain 1) were more likely (59% (43/73) v 39% (13/33)) to have implemented routine screening for falls risk for patients who attend A&E (or MIU). Every PCO should develop a strategy to address routine case finding for high risk patients.
- One out of 4 (25%, 88/352) falls services have no agreed referral criteria for dual energy x-ray absorptiometry (DXA) scanning, a role for which is clearly indicated in NICE guidance on secondary prevention after fractures.
- The NICE technology appraisal requires PCOs to make funding available for the approved medication for osteoporosis. It does **not** require commissioners or providers to ensure that it is actually prescribed. New incentives or other methods must be used to solve this problem.
- One in 8 acute trusts (12%, 21/175) do not have a geriatrician with any commitment to falls services. This was an essential component of a falls service in the NSF. Medicine is part of the service and every service needs a champion.
- Still too few services use patient's views (51%, 179/353) to support and guide service improvement. The CEEU, in collaboration with Help the Aged, has piloted a patient experience questionnaire suitable for use, which will soon be available for any trust to use.

Public indicator tables: How to use these tables – refer to page 10 for the key to the question content and responses

Over these pages the results are presented for each primary care, health and social care and acute NHS trust in terms of their public indicators and are arranged by domain then by Strategic Health Authority (SHA).

The public indicators illustrate what services are provided by whom, as well as selected details of provision. So for any one trust there may gaps in the services they provide but these may be provided by a neighbouring organisation. Therefore the selected details of falls and bone health service provision need to be reviewed for each local health community as a whole. The indicators can be used as a basis for comparison between sites of the same type (e.g. between one primary care trust and another) but cannot be used to compare trusts of different types but even this comparison needs to be used within each local community setting.

Each page presents results in one of the English Strategic Health Authorities, or Northern Ireland, or Wales. This allows you to grasp fairly quickly which organisation is providing which service within your local area. You should bear in mind, however, that the audit does not assess how well-connected the care pathway is for individual patients. The falls & bone health *clinical* audit (2010/11) provides the best picture of what services patients can reliably expect to receive.

Appendices

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Appendix 1

GLOSSARY

Audit: A process to determine from available documentation and records, whether defined activities are conducted according to predefined agreed standards.

National Audit: National audit is performed when standards apply equally throughout across the country. In this case separate NSF's apply to England and Wales, NICE guidance to England and Wales, but with agreement from the relevant trusts, this audit covers England, Wales, the Channel Islands and Northern Ireland.

Organisational Audit: Audit of the organisation, i.e. its structures, policies and processes. It indicates how things are set up to work but does not capture what actually happens to individual patients.

Clinical audit: Audit of activities (e.g. assessments, treatments or provision of information or equipment) that have taken place with individual patients, as recorded in clinical records etc.

Benchmarking: Measurement of performance against a standard reached by others. For example in national audit this could be the top score or the national average.

Care home: A residential home providing nursing and/or personal care, in addition to living accommodation.

Carer: Someone (commonly the older person's spouse, a close relative or a friend) who provides ongoing support or assistance

Domain: For the audit web tool and this report, the organisation of falls and bone health services is divided into 6 key sections (domains).

Case finding: People are identified for intervention because of fragility fracture or the presence of strong risk factors for falling.

DXA scanning: Dual energy X-ray absorptiometry (DXA) scanning is a means of measuring bone mineral density.

Evidence-based exercise programmes: Evidence has shown the type, intensity and duration of exercise which is necessary to be effective in reducing falls rates. Two programmes are strongly supported by existing evidence:

FaME (Falls Management Exercise) exercise programme - Participants attend a weekly class run by a trained exercise instructor (could be physiotherapist, postural stability instructor, registered exercise professional), lasting for one hour or more (including warm-up) over at least 24 weeks. The exercise is modified according to individual progress and the participants are encouraged to perform the exercises at home at least twice weekly. (Skelton DA, Dinan SM, Campbell M, Rutherford OM. **FaME (Falls Management Exercise):** an RCT on the effects of a 9-month group exercise programme in frequently falling community dwelling women age 65 and over. *J Aging Phys Act* 2004; 12: 457–8).

Otago home exercise programme - Participants are seen at home by a trained exercise instructor (could be physiotherapist, postural stability instructor, Otago exercise leader, registered exercise professional) at least 3 times during the first 8 weeks and the participants are encouraged to perform the exercises at home at least three times weekly for one hour or more (including warm-up) and also to walk outdoors. They are also encouraged to continue exercises for at least one year and the exercise is modified according to individual progress. (Robertson MC, Devlin N, Gardner MM, Campbell JC. Effectiveness and economic evaluation of a nurse delivered home exercise programme to prevent falls. 1: Randomised controlled trial. *BMJ* 2001; 322:697–701).

Fall: A fall is defined as “an event whereby an individual comes to rest on the ground or another lower level with or without loss of consciousness” (Guideline for the prevention of falls in older persons. American Geriatrics Society, British Geriatrics Society and American Association of Orthopaedic Surgeons Panel on Falls Prevention. Journal American Geriatric Society 2001; 49:664)

Fall service coordinator: A person with specific commitment to the falls clinical service, as well as service development, administration, teaching, training and audit etc. This may be a nurse consultant, nurse practitioner, physiotherapist, or occupational therapist.

Falls Service: The NSF refers to “an integrated specialist falls service”. For the audit this is taken to mean a coordinated, integrated, multi-professional and multi-agency service.

Coordinated: using a regular mechanism or meeting to agree strategy and review progress towards objectives.

Multi-agency: e.g. health, local authority, voluntary sector.

Multi-professional: e.g. medical, nursing, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, social work.

Integrated: working to agreed protocols & pathways, utilising agreed communication pathways.

Fracture Liaison Nurse: A nurse with a specific commitment to enhancing the case finding and management of patients with a fragility fracture to improve their bone health and reduce risk of further fracture. This may include ensuring falls interventions are delivered to those with fractures, service development, administration, teaching, training, audit etc. A few organisations may have a fracture liaison therapist providing a similar service.

Fracture Liaison Service: Delivered by a Fracture Liaison Nurse (see above), to identify, assess and treat fracture risk.

Fragility fractures: Defined as a fracture resulting from low trauma, such as a fall from a standing height or as a result of lesser force. Consideration is given to this definition at any site except fractures of the skull and small bones of the hand and foot.

Healthcare Commission Annual Health Check Core Standard 5a: The Annual Health Check assesses the quality of services and financial management. **Core standard C5a** focuses on ensuring that healthcare organisations conform to NICE technology appraisals and, where it is available, takes into account nationally agreed guidance when planning and delivering treatment and care.

Home hazard assessment and interventions: Identification of environmental hazards within the person’s home by a trained healthcare professional. Examples of assessments include Westmead Home Safety Assessment and HOME FAST (Home Falls and Accidents Screening Tool). The older person should then be offered safety interventions or home modifications as required (e.g. removal of loose rugs, provision of grab rails).

In-patient falls prevention/reduction policy: This may be closely linked to other clinical and/or health and safety policies. It needs to include policies to minimise risk of falling of patients and include consideration of individual falls risk factors. It is not a policy limited to staff health or to environmental safety issues.

Inter Quartile Range (IQR): The range between 25th and 75th centile when all the results are ranked from highest to lowest, i.e. it covers the middle fifty percent of results. NOTE that this does not mean that the results were distributed from a score of 100 to zero.

Intervention plan: Mechanism whereby various interventions have been derived from the individual multi-factorial falls risk assessment and agreed in writing with the older person.

Joint Strategic Needs Assessment: “is a systematic method for reviewing the health and well-being needs of a population, leading to agreed commissioning priorities that will improve health and well-being outcomes and reduce inequalities”, *DH Guidance on Joint Strategic Needs Assessment, 2007*

Local population based report on health needs and outcomes: This may be an annual report produced by primary care Director of Public Health or a joint strategic needs assessment that includes population-based details with regard to falls and bone health. It is not an activity based report on the falls service.

Median: This is the middle point of the data set, when all the results are ranked from highest to lowest. Half of the values are below this point, and half are above this point.

Minor Injuries Units (MIUs): These units provide treatment for less serious injuries, such as sprains, cuts and grazes that do not require admission to an acute hospital.

Multi-Factorial Falls Risk Assessment (MFFRA): A falls specialist assessment should be a multi-factorial falls risk assessment performed by healthcare professionals with appropriate skill and experience normally in the setting of a specialist falls service. The falls service needs to operate in such a way as to ensure that assessment addresses all the necessary components (e.g. assessment of vision impairment) in a standardised way. This could be through specific documentation, or a formatted report etc.

National Service Framework for Older People, Department of Health (NSF), England was published in March 2001. There is a separate NSF for Wales (2006). The NSF's set national standards and service models of care across health and social services for all older people whether they live at home, in residential care or are being cared for in hospital.

National Institute for Health and Clinical Excellence (NICE): is an independent organisation responsible for providing national guidance on promoting good health and preventing and treating ill health.

Older People: For the purpose of this audit, this applies to people over 65 generally, as indicated in the National Service Framework.

Osteoporosis: A disease of bone that leads to an increased risk of fracture. The generally accepted definition from the WHO is based on the measurement of bone mineral density using a DEXA scan and then comparison of this with the population average for younger people.

Pathway: The patient's care pathway should be agreed and implemented by health and social services, and should include referral criteria and onward arrangements.

Orthopaedic ward: A ward within the hospital providing care for people with fractures.

Public indicator: see page 10

Quality and Outcomes Framework (QOF) is a voluntary annual reward and incentive programme for all GP surgeries in England, detailing practice achievement results. It is not about performance management but resourcing and then rewarding good practice. The QOF rewards GPs for implementing good practice in their surgeries. The QOF comprises a range of criteria which are grouped into 5 domains: clinical care, organisational, patient experience, additional services and holistic care.

Secondary prevention: Intervention aimed at reducing risk of a recurrent event, e.g. to prevent fragility fractures and falls in a person who has already fallen.

Single Assessment Process (SAP) is implemented at different levels - overview, contact, specialist in depth and comprehensive assessments. The "overview" assessment utilised in a locality should include relevant questions relating to falls and osteoporosis and a positive answer should lead to further assessment (e.g. the MFFRA).

Site: In this audit, a site is an organisation, which can be a mental health trust, care home, primary care organisation (which includes primary care trusts and local health boards), acute trust, or health and social care trust, which includes Northern Ireland and the Islands. An organisation may have more than one hospital, but would be considered as one site. However, where an organisation has two or more localities with quite separate services, these would be considered as separate sites.

Syncope: Medical term for a sudden, transient loss of consciousness, generally caused by temporary insufficient blood supply to the brain. Syncope assessments include tilt table testing, carotid sinus massage and 24 hour cardiac rhythm monitoring.

Trusts: In the context of the National Health Service (NHS), trusts are organisational units, e.g. hospital trusts, community trusts, primary care trusts or combinations thereof.

Primary care organisation (PCO): The exact term differs in different parts of the UK. In England, primary care trusts (PCT's) are the responsible local NHS body for commissioning but are also responsible for local provision of direct community and primary care services including general medical practice. Acute trusts are separate bodies responsible for providing services only.

In Northern Ireland, the Health and Social Care Trust provides a full range of health and social care services to the local population

In the Channel Isles and Isle of Man, the local governments directly manage the primary, community and acute hospitals.

In Wales the local NHS body is the Local Health Board (numbering 22 at the time of the audit) which directly provides primary, community and acute hospital services.

MHTs are mental health care trusts, providers of mental healthcare services which are commissioned by PCOs. In one case, Portsmouth City, the PCT is also the provider of mental healthcare services
